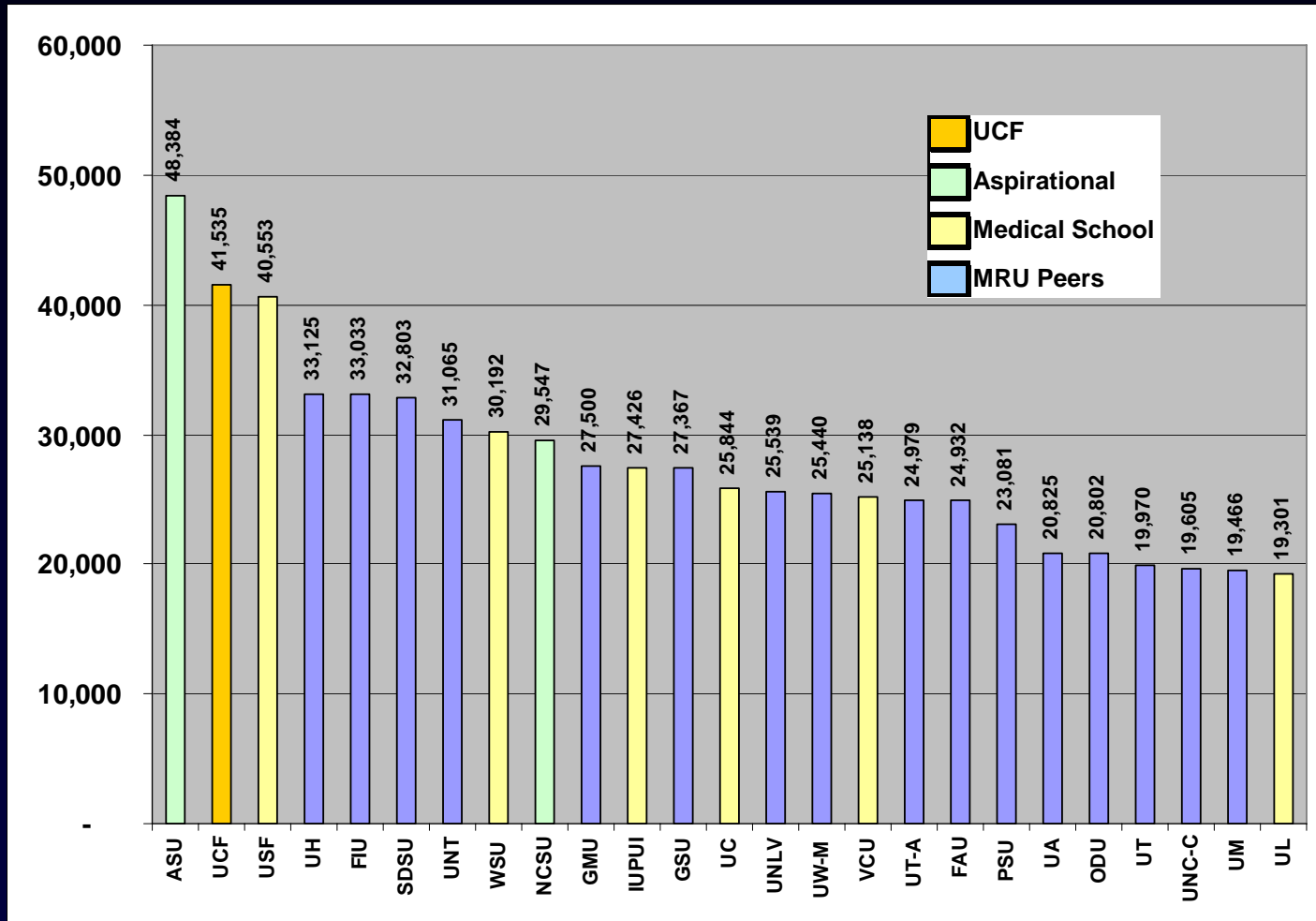

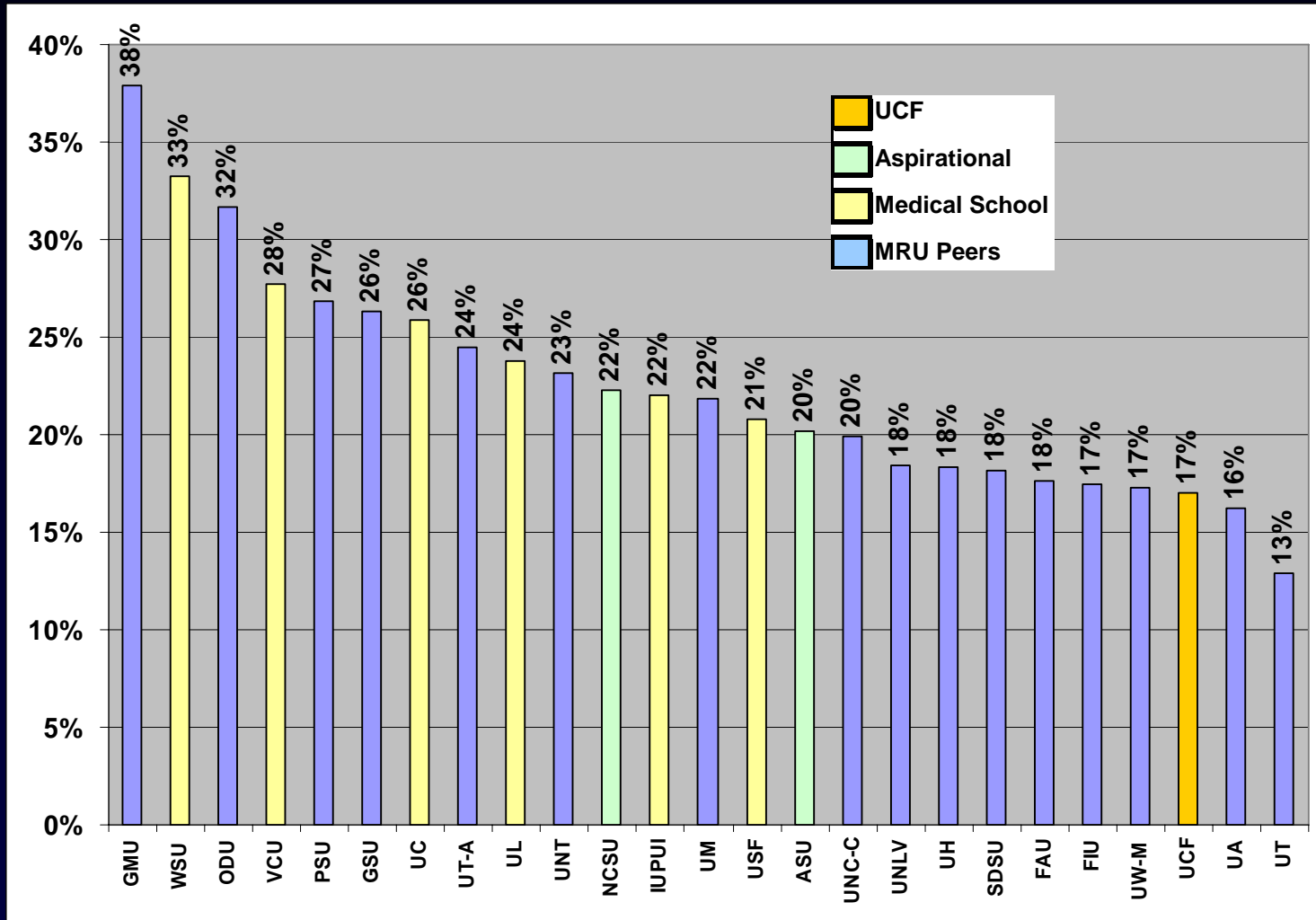

# Percent Graduate Enrollment

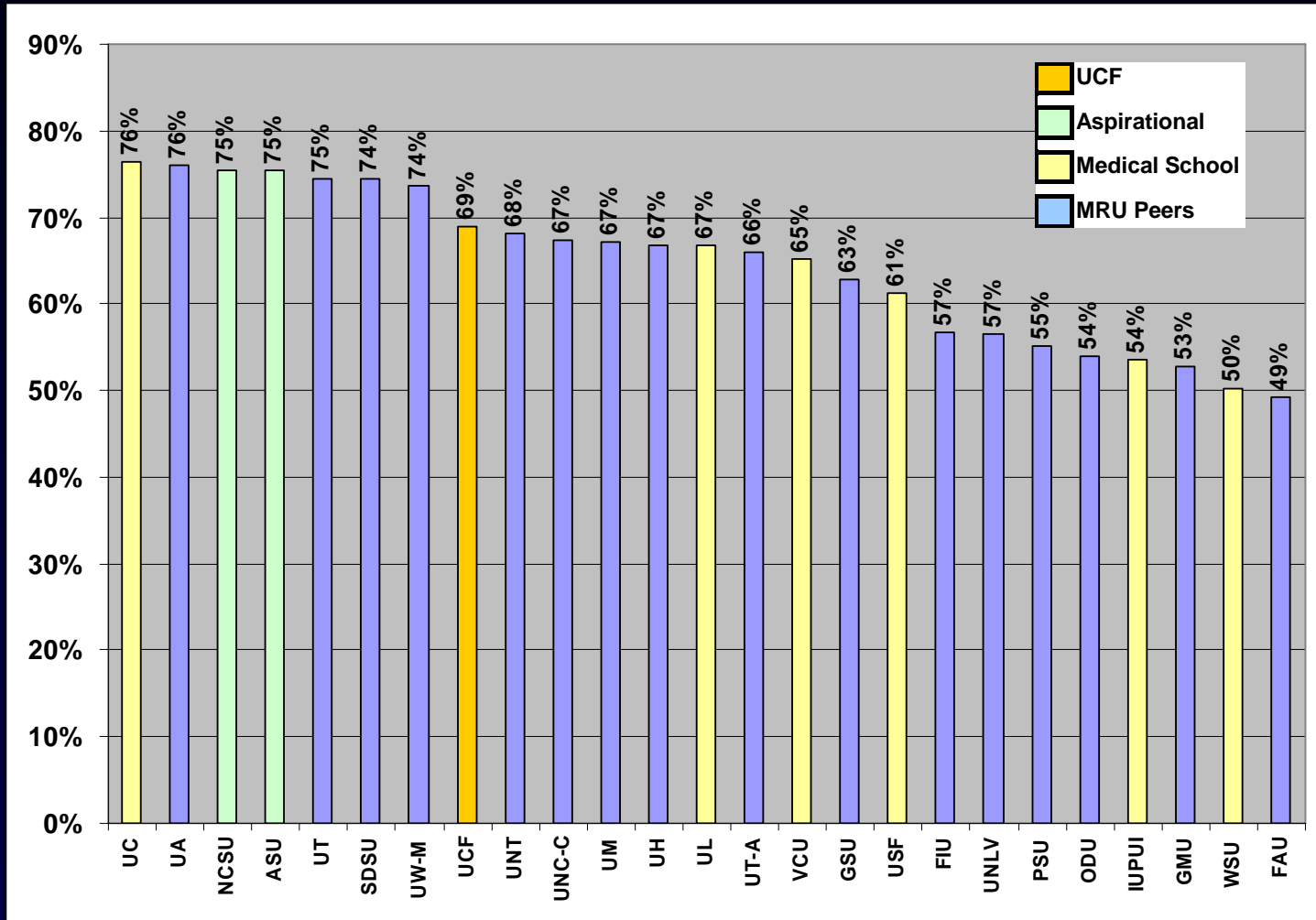

# Percent Full-time Students

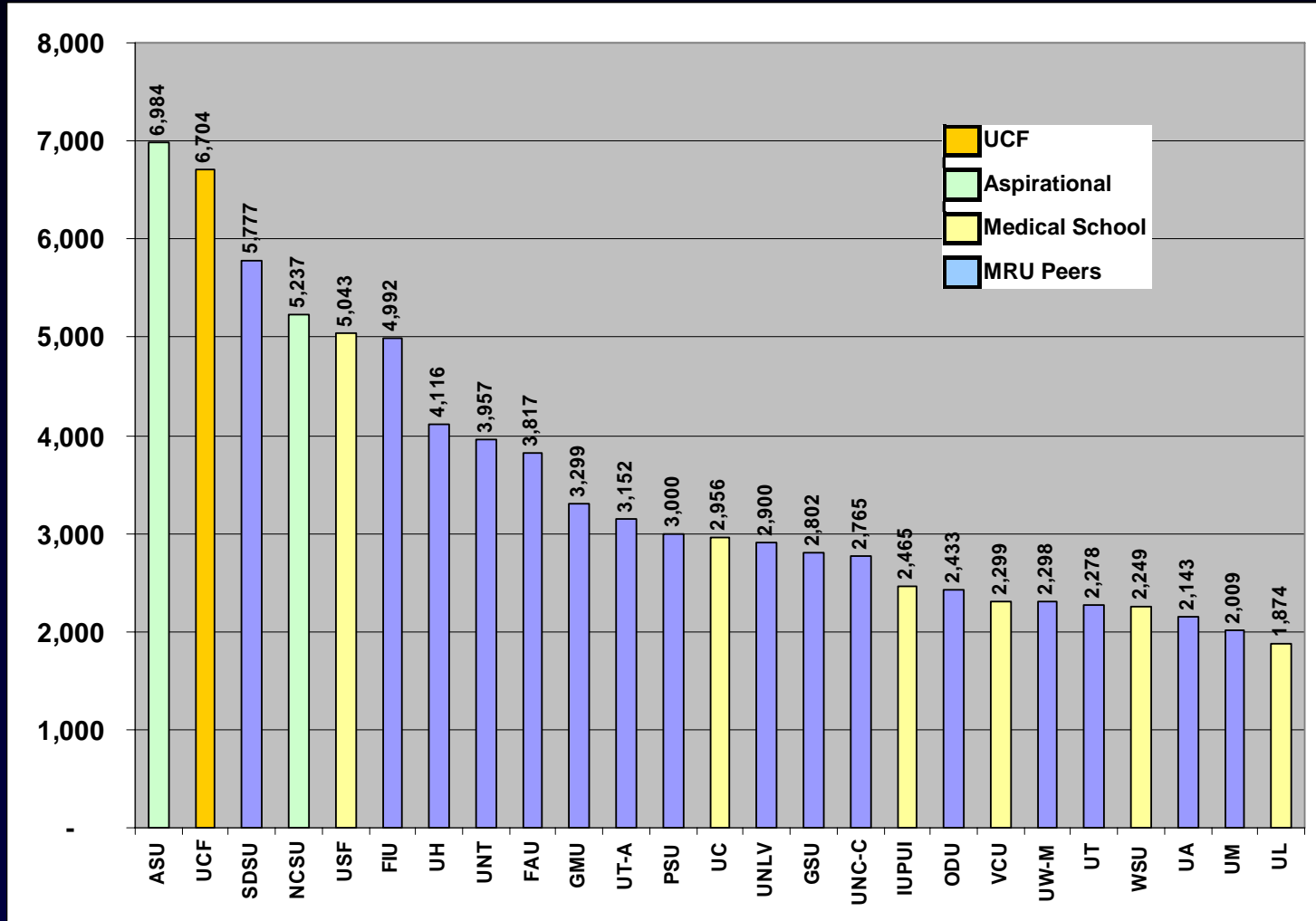

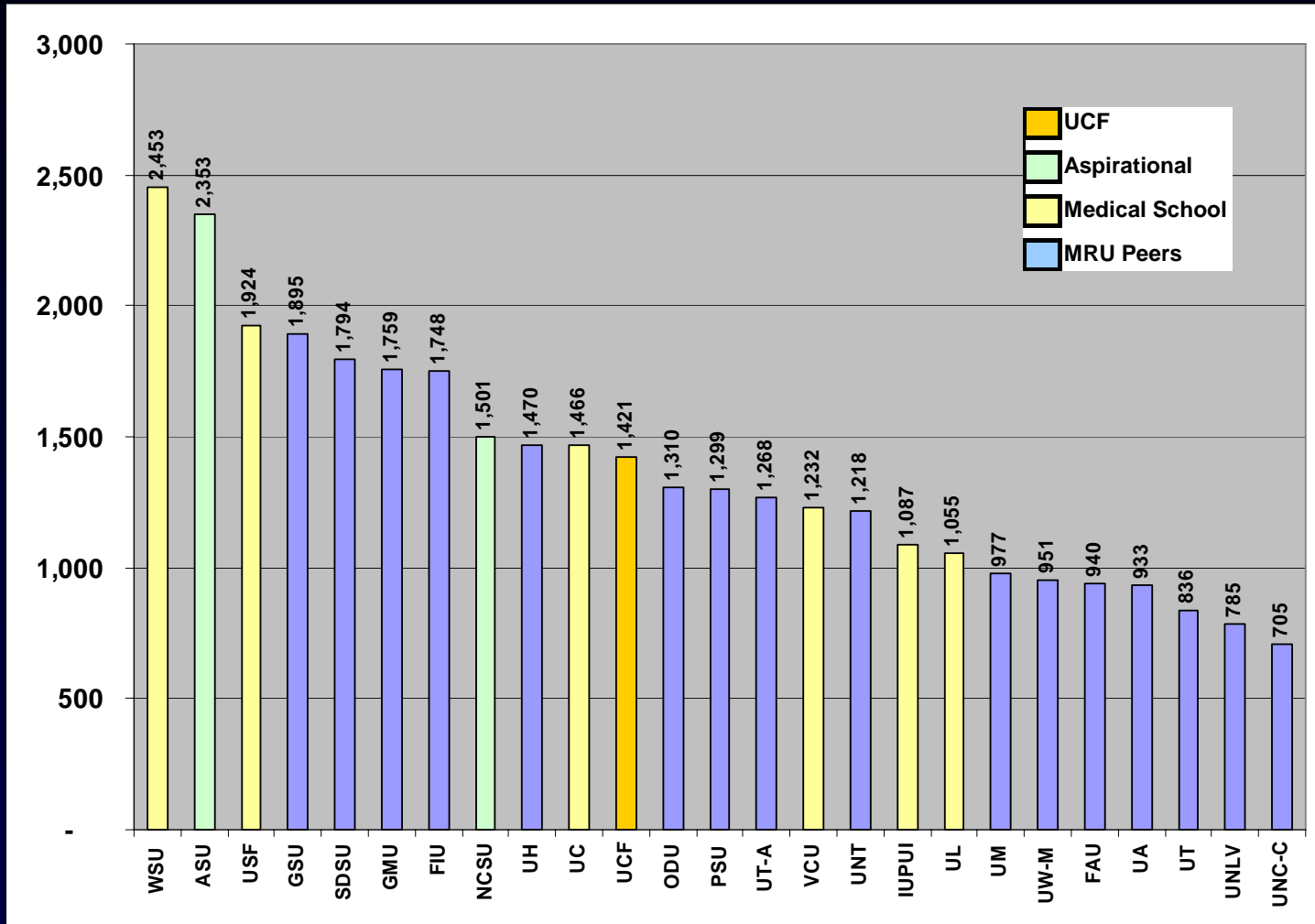
# Degree Production: Baccalaureate

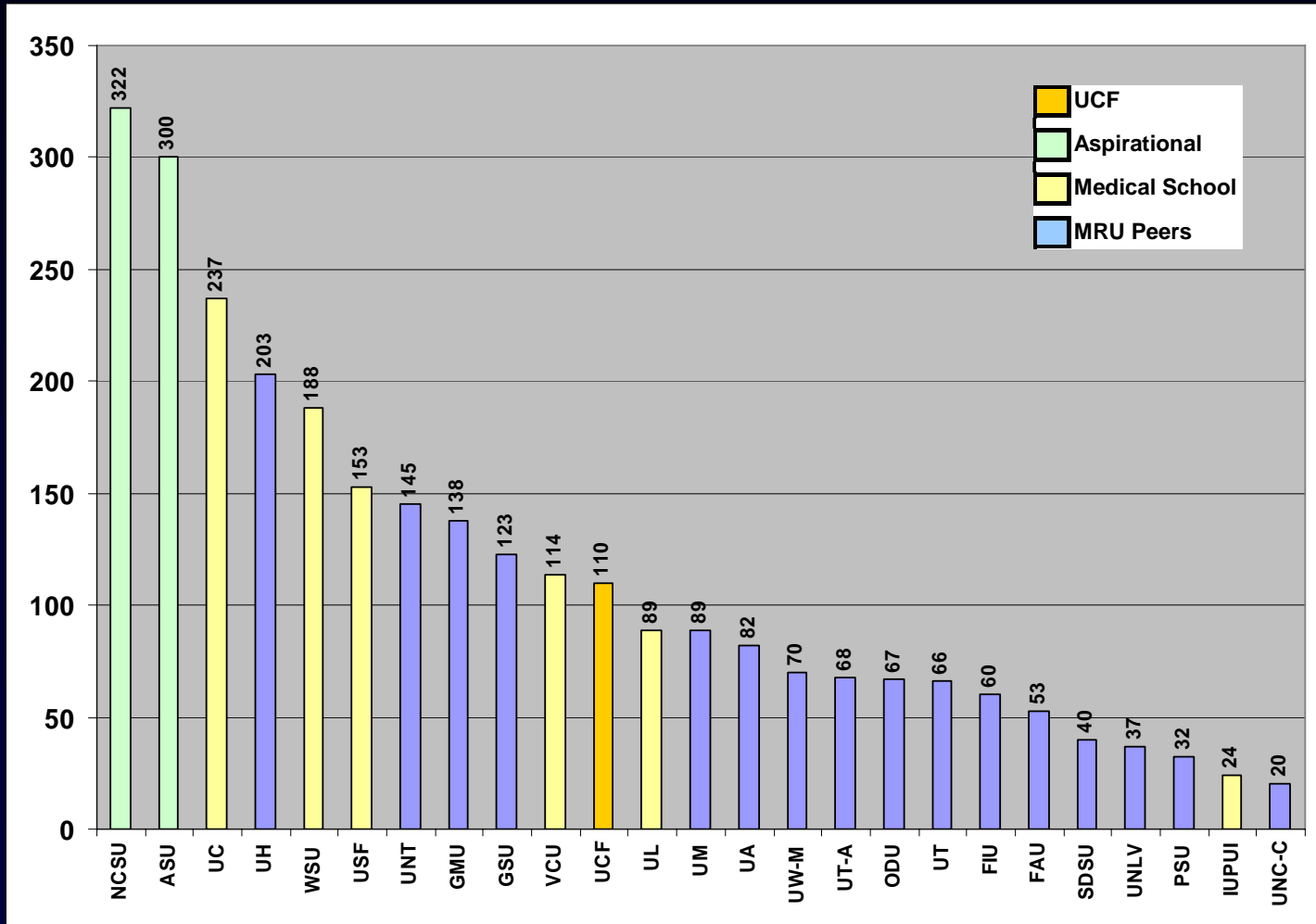
# Degree Production: Master's

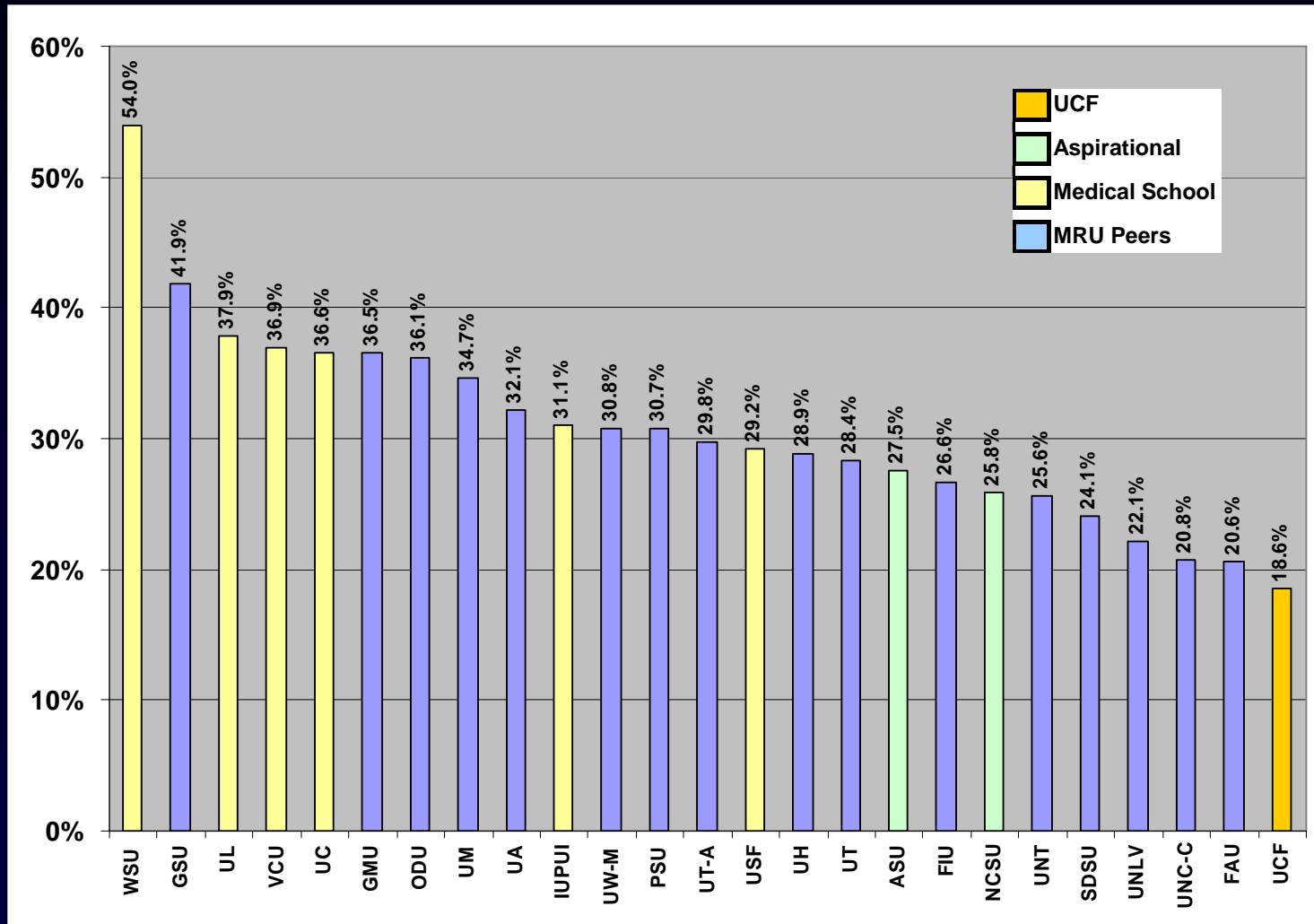
# Degree Production: Doctoral

# Degree Production: Percent Graduate

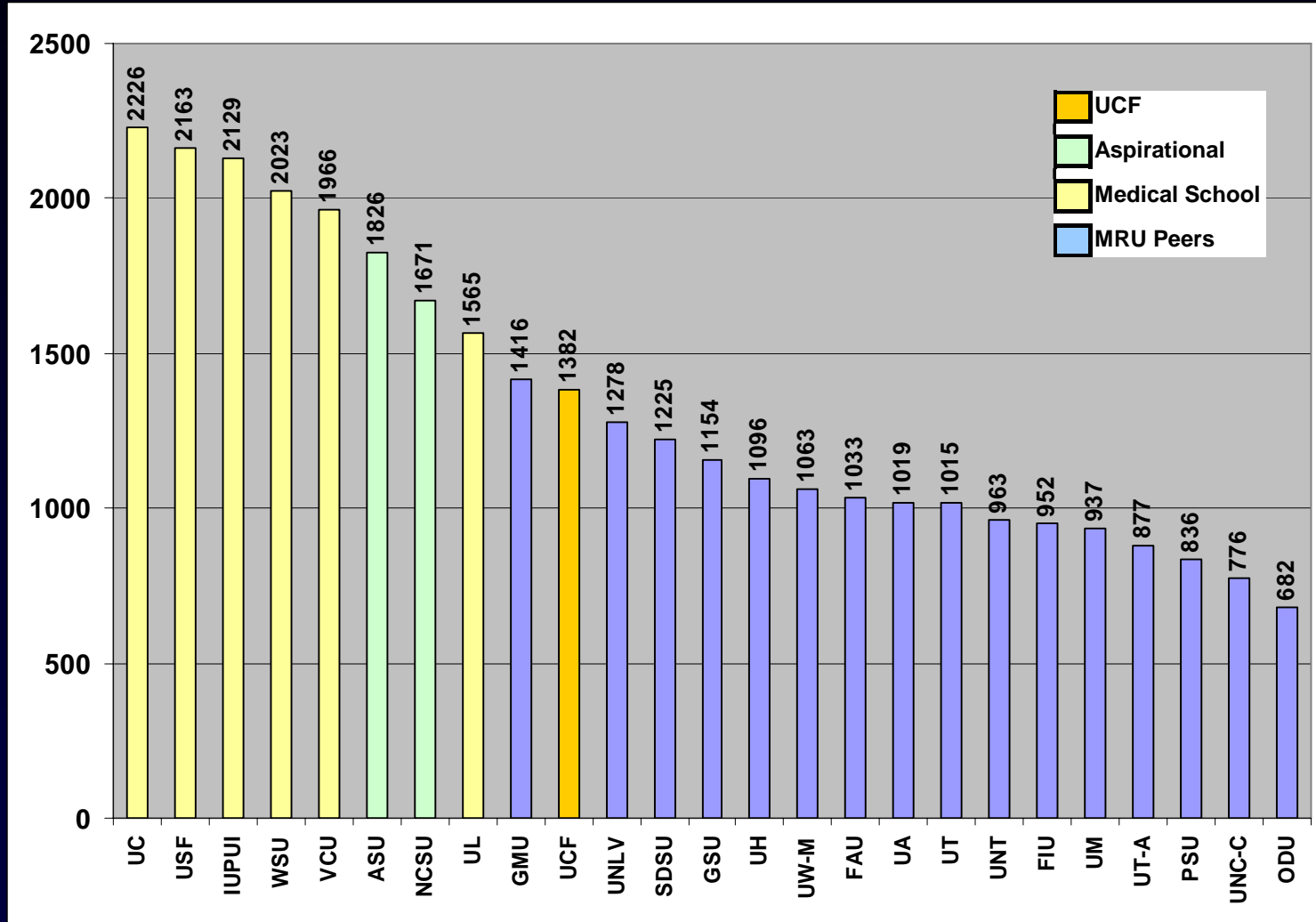

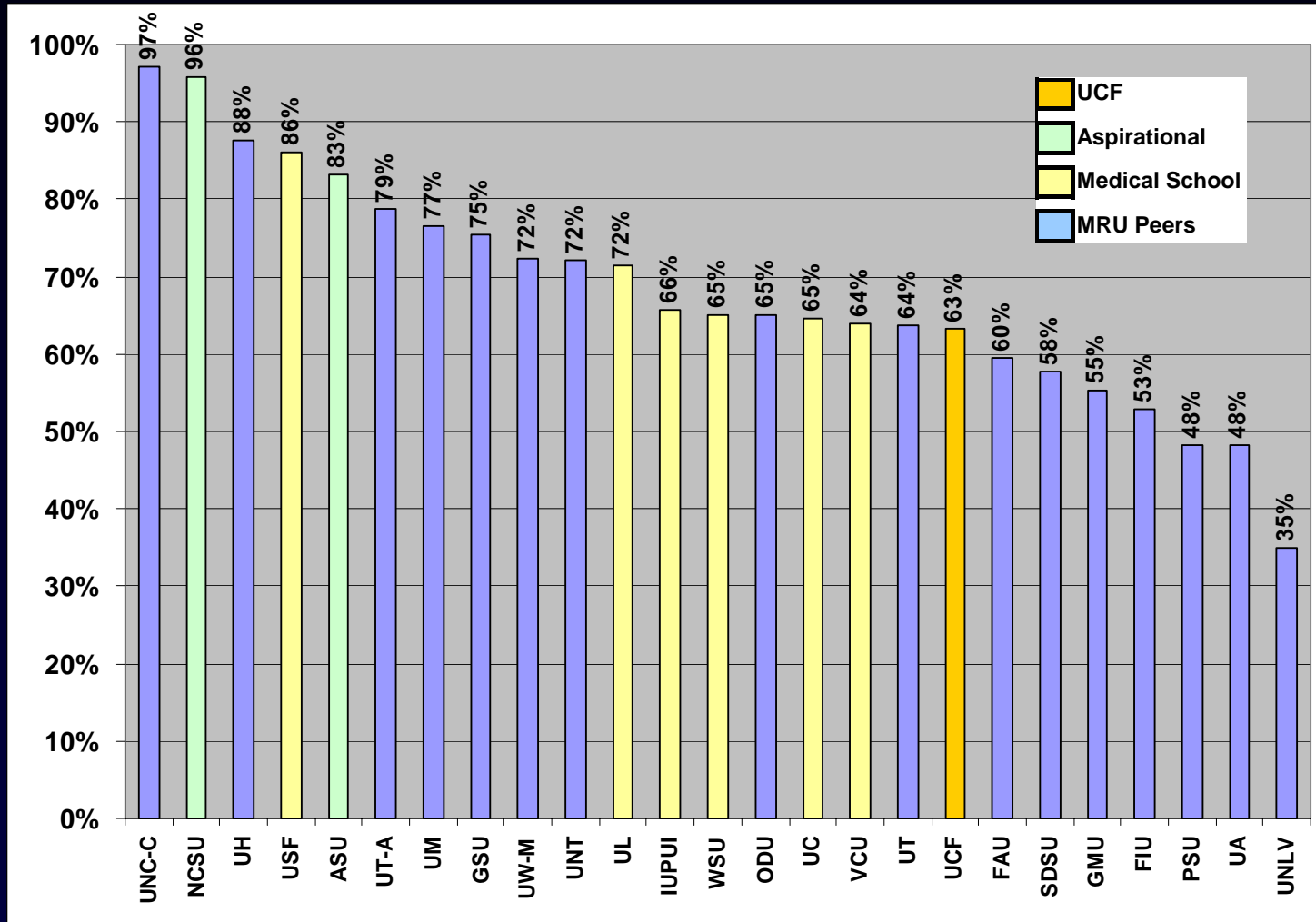
# Full-time Equivalent Faculty

# Percent Full-time Faculty

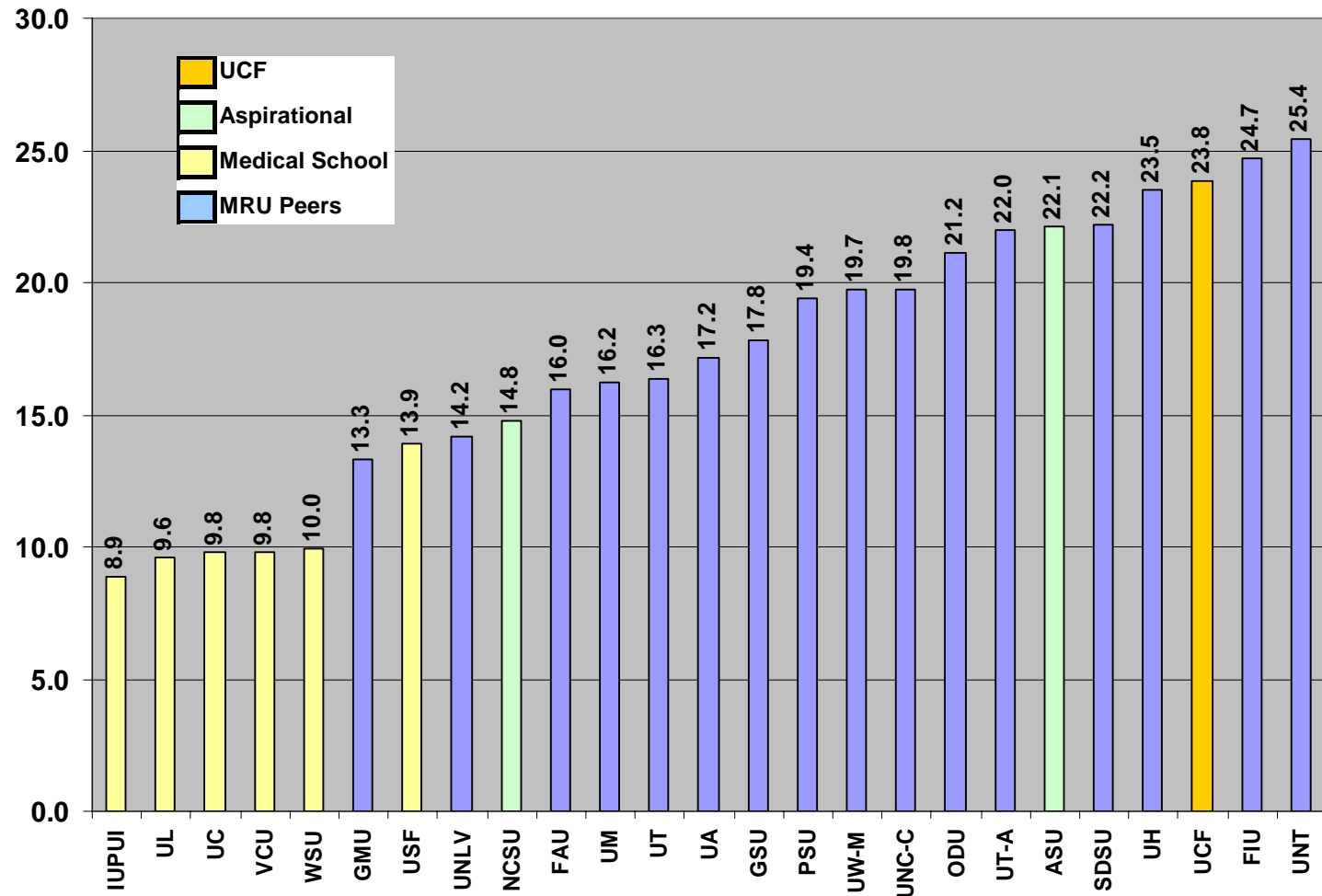

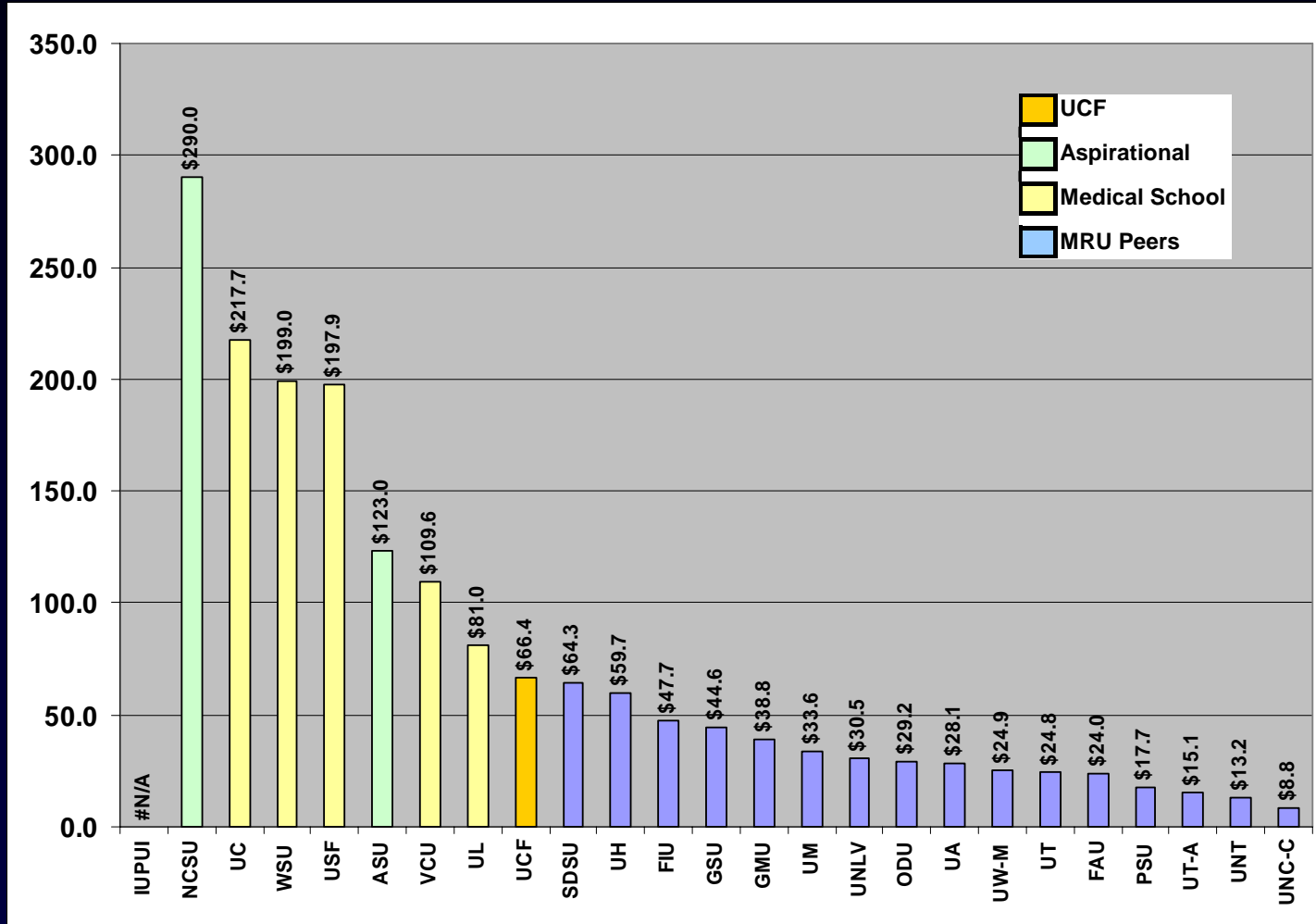
# Student-to-Faculty Ratio

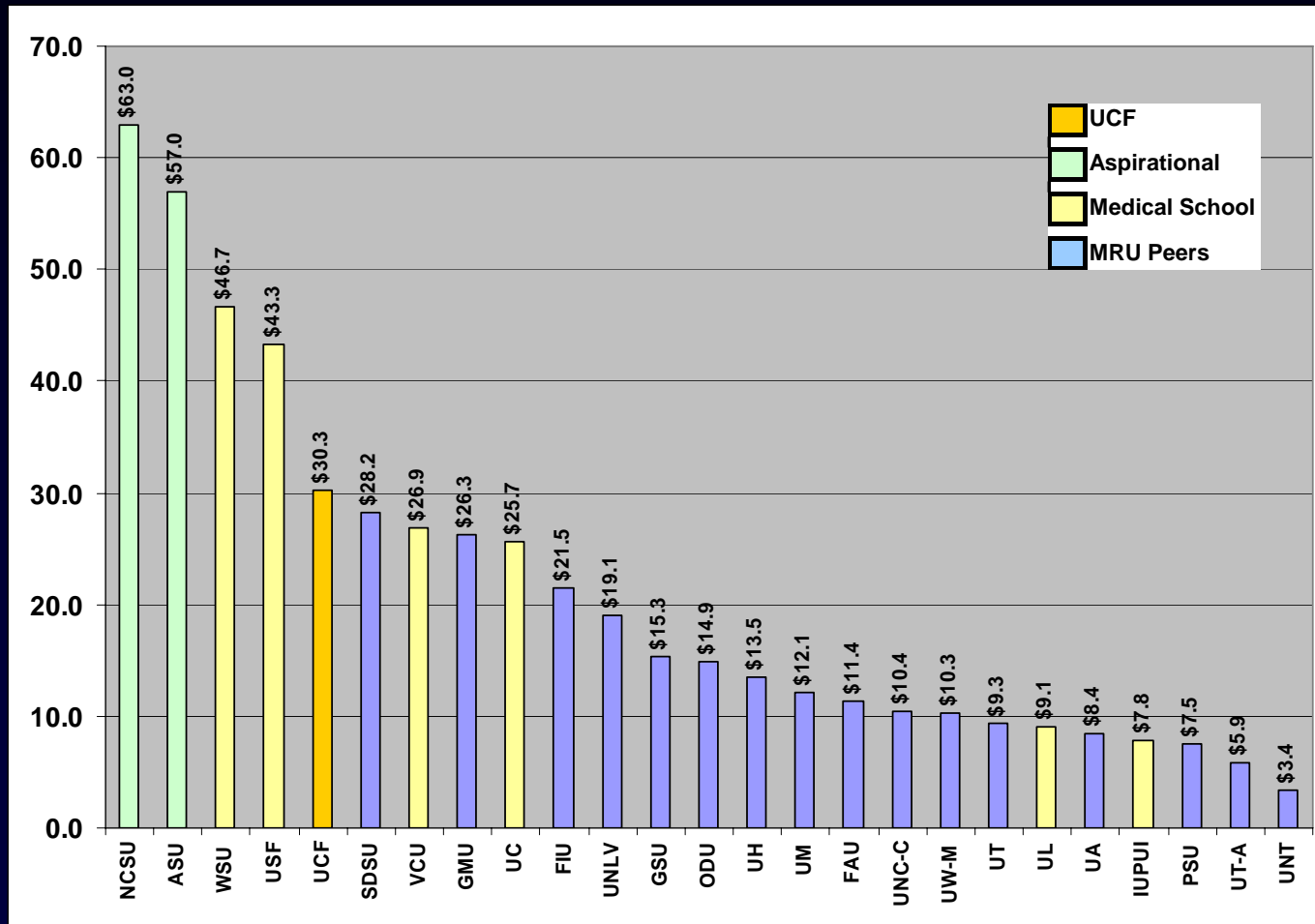
# Total Research Expenditures (NSF)

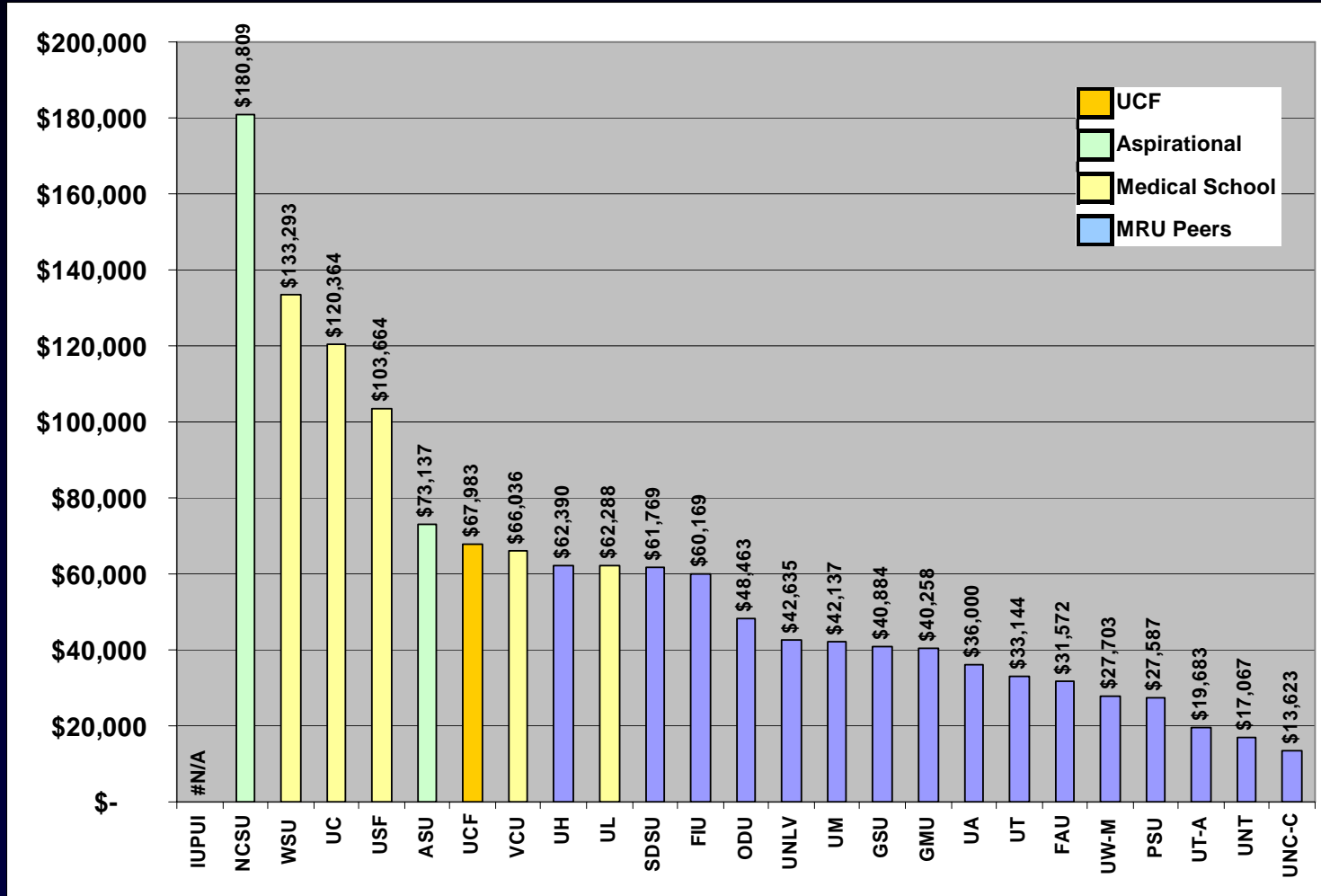
# Federal Research Awards (RAND) Excluding Medical Schools

# Total Research per Full-time Faculty

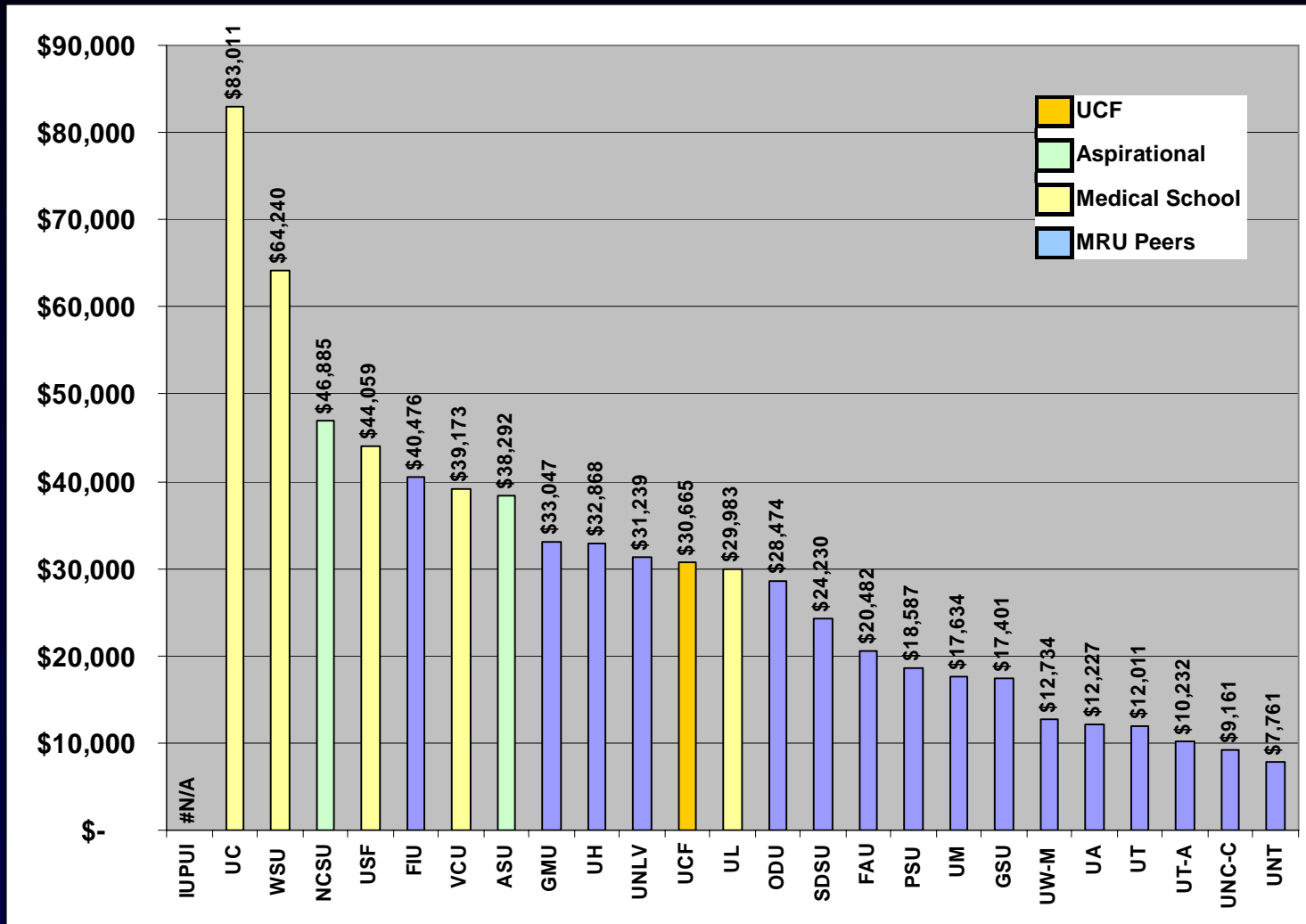

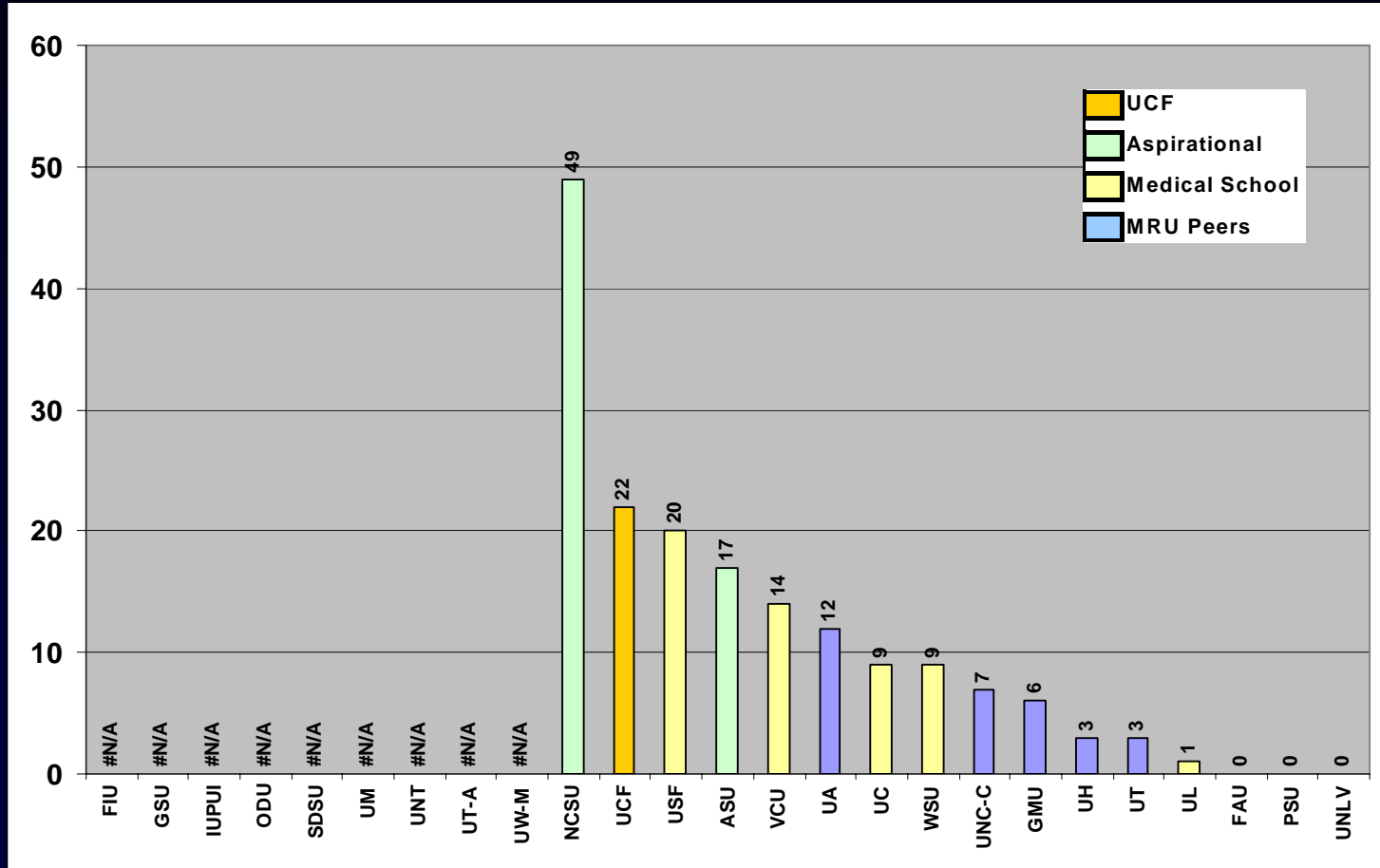

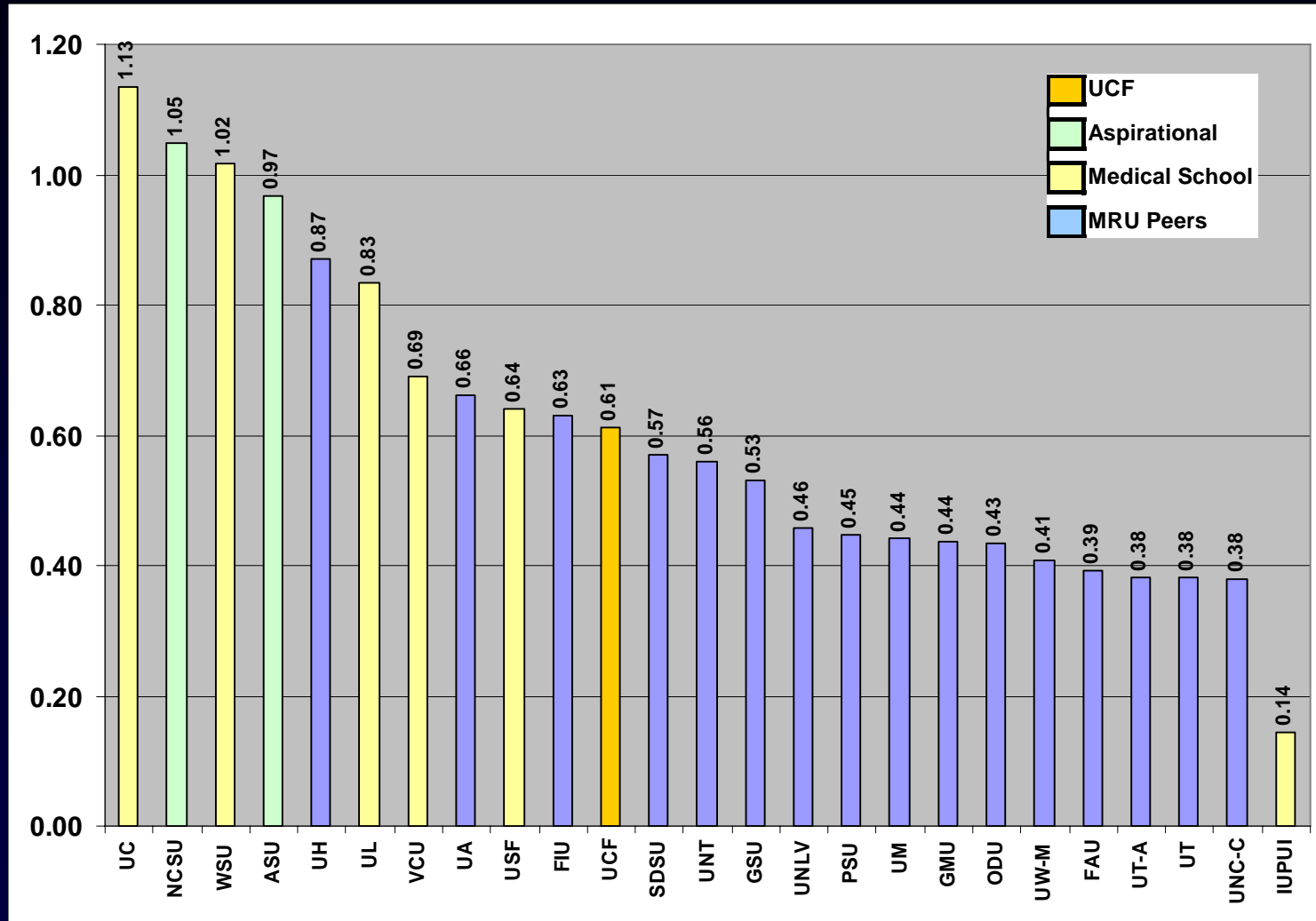
# Number of Patents

# Publications per Full-time Faculty

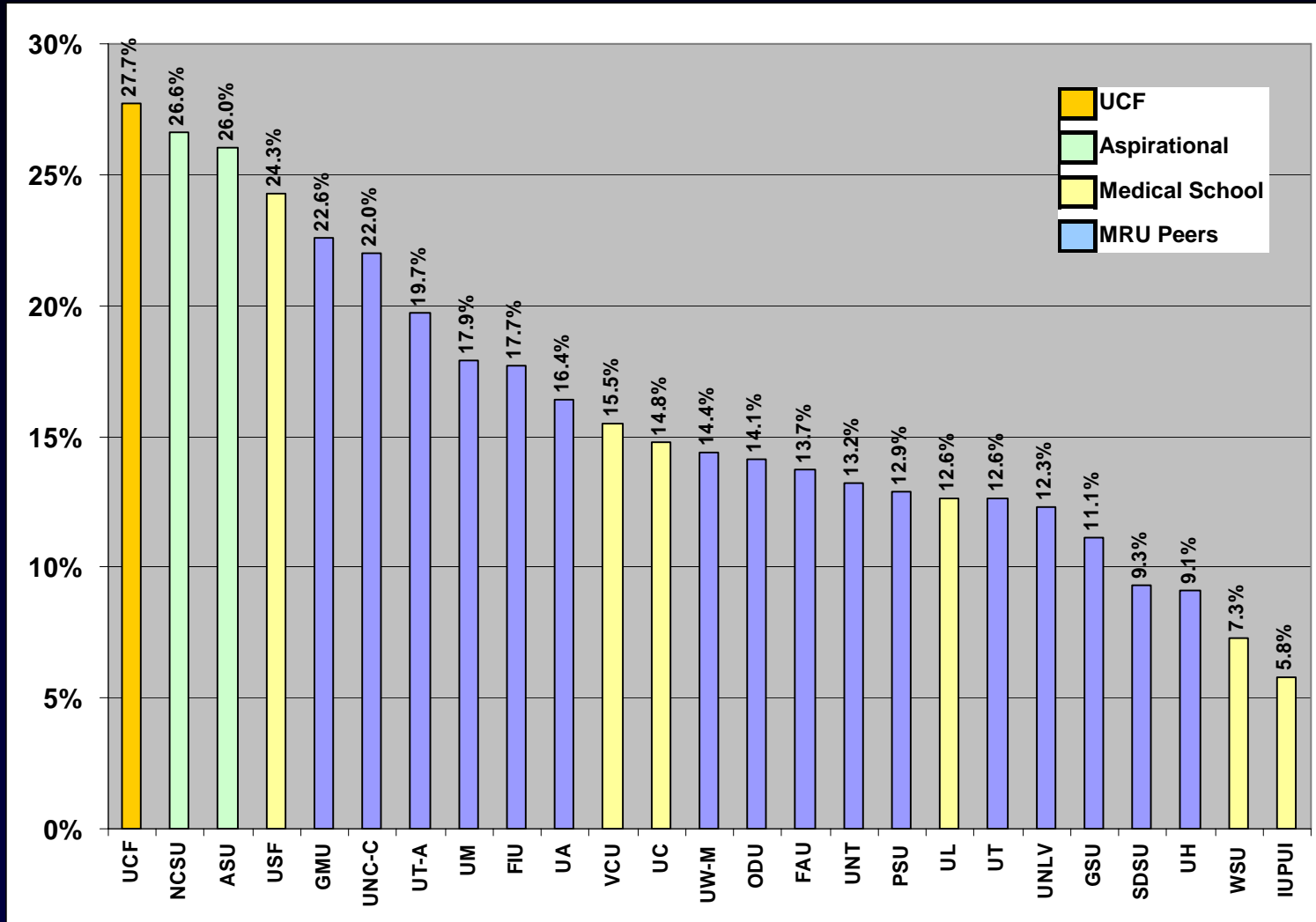

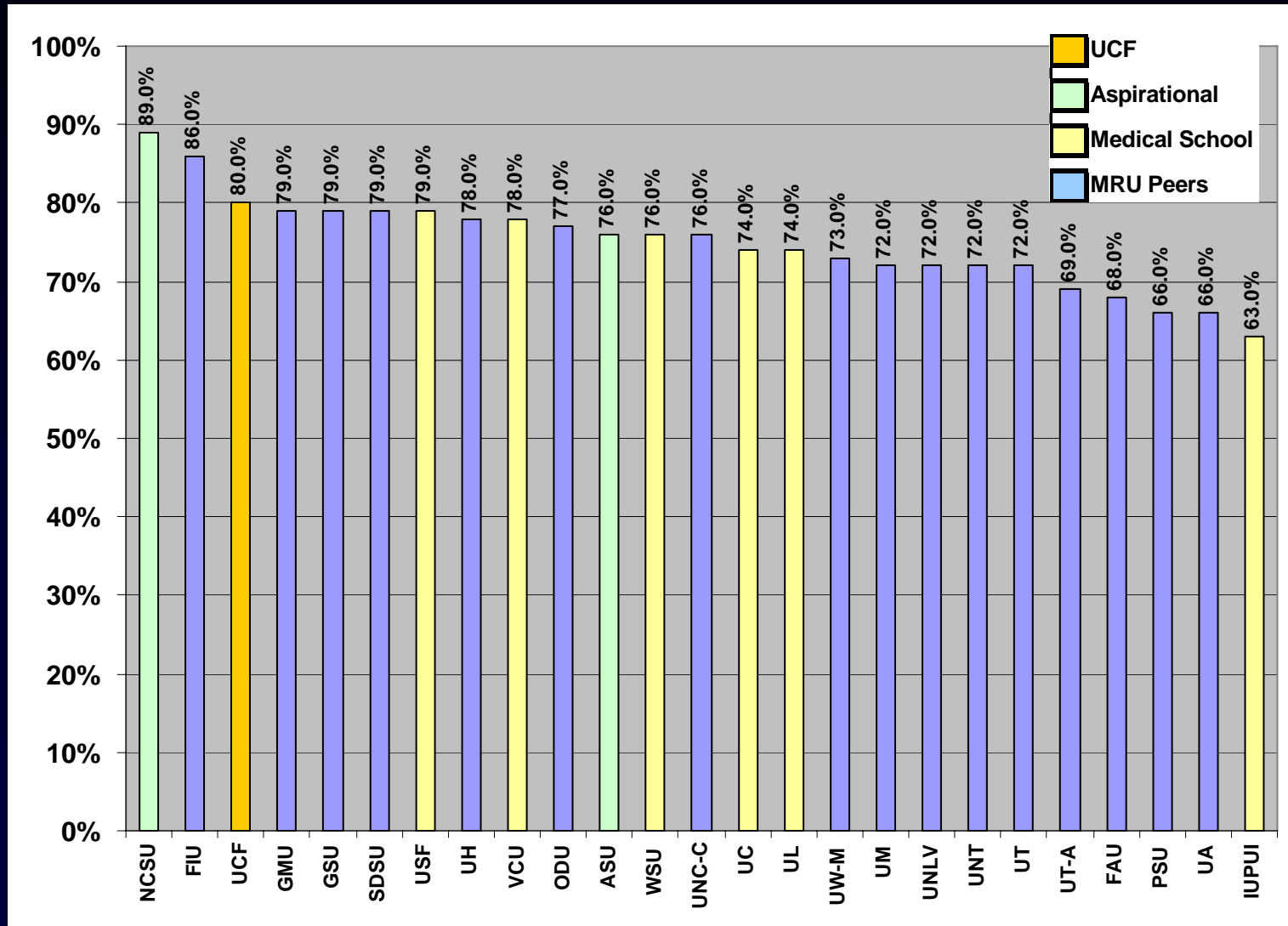
# Six-year Graduation Rate

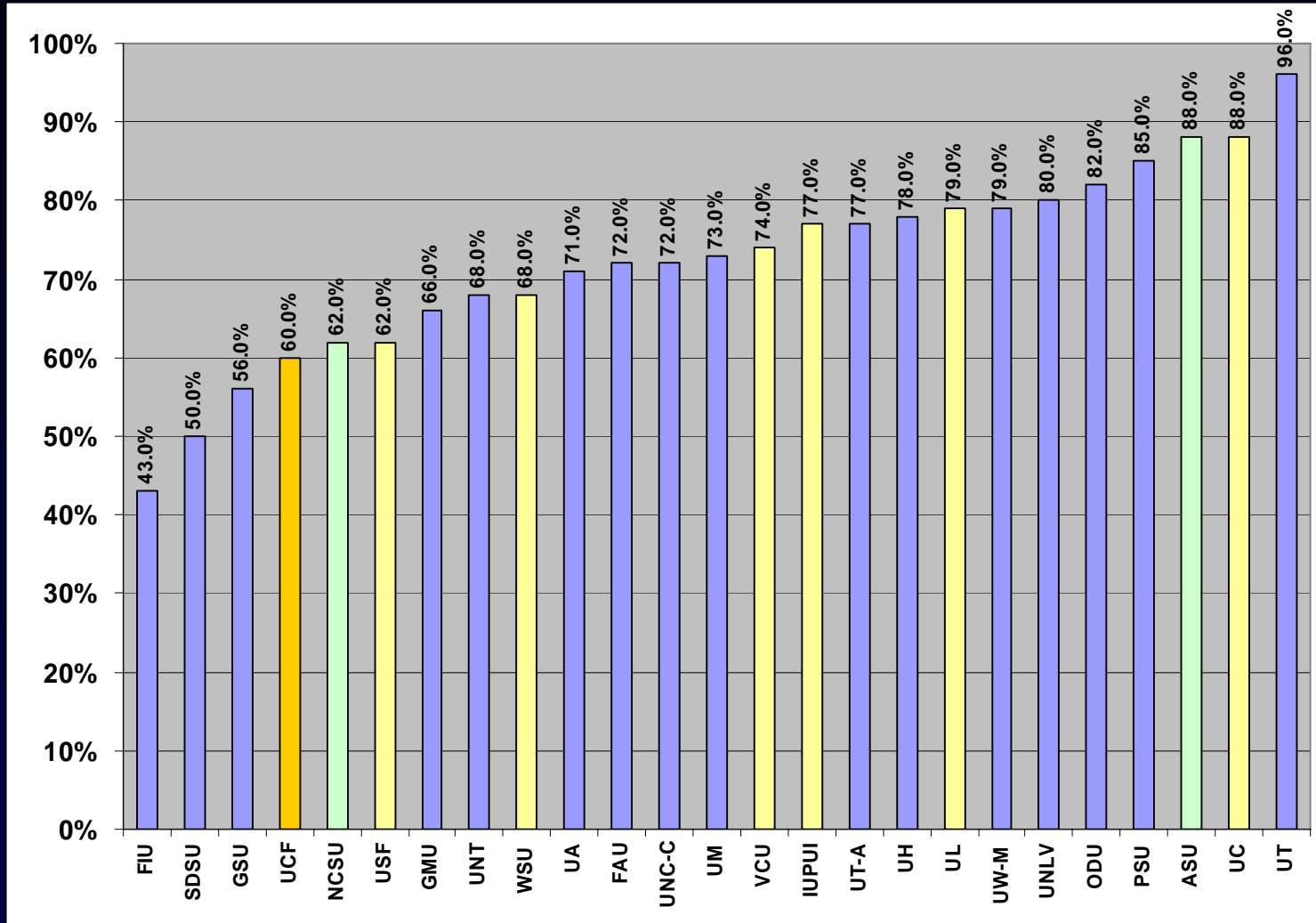
# First-year FTIC Retention

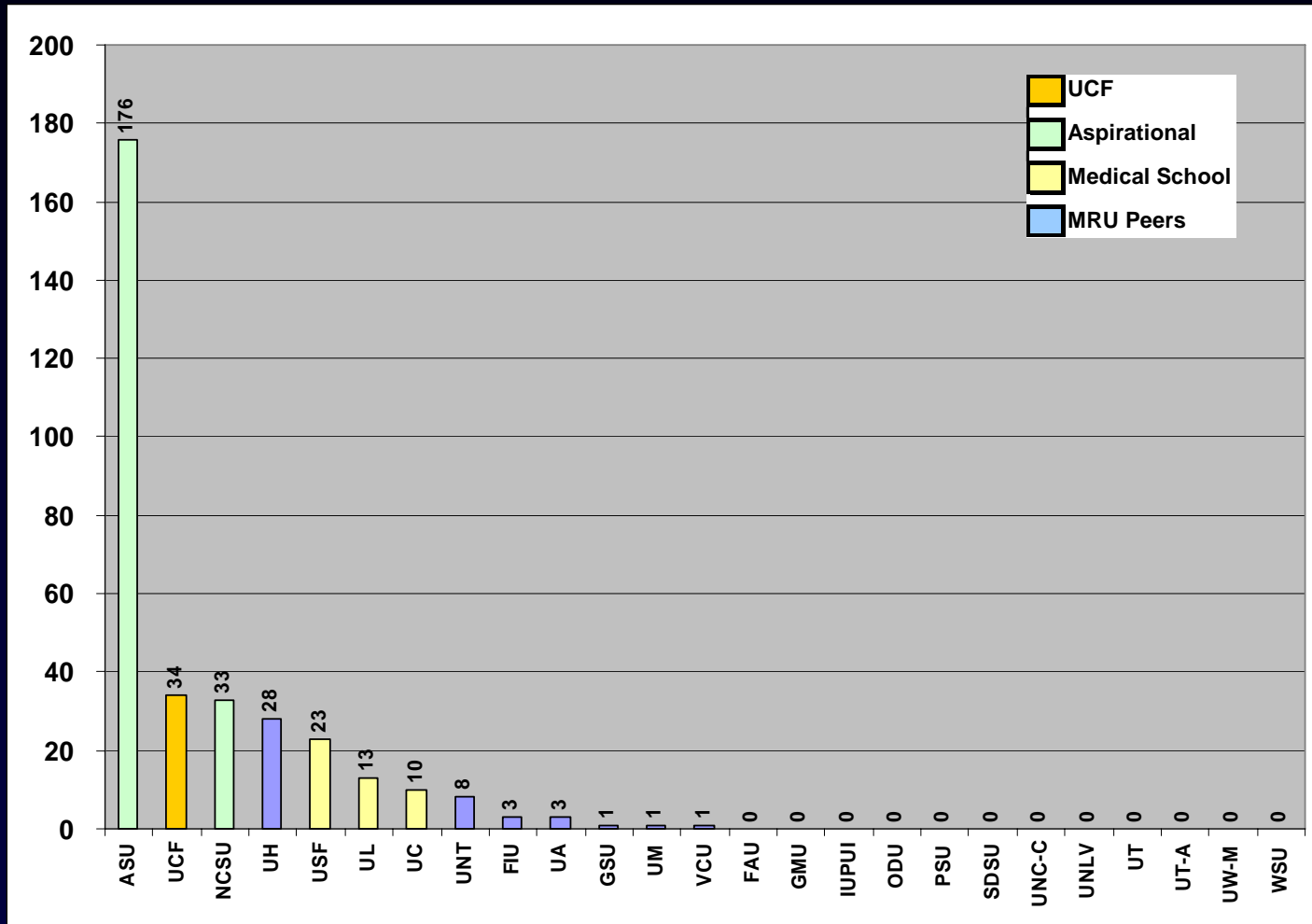
# Acceptance Rate (Selectivity)

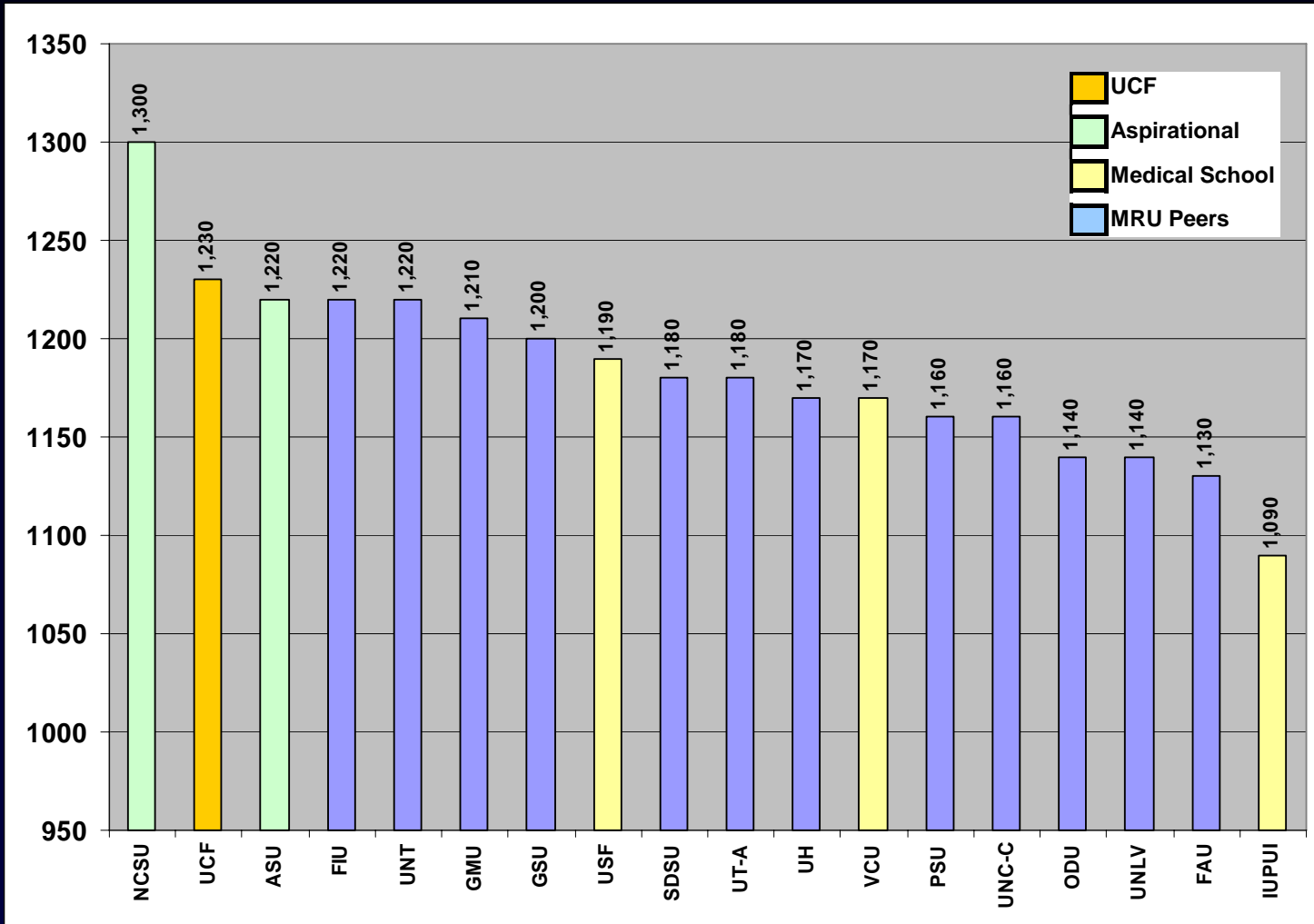
# Number of Merit Scholars

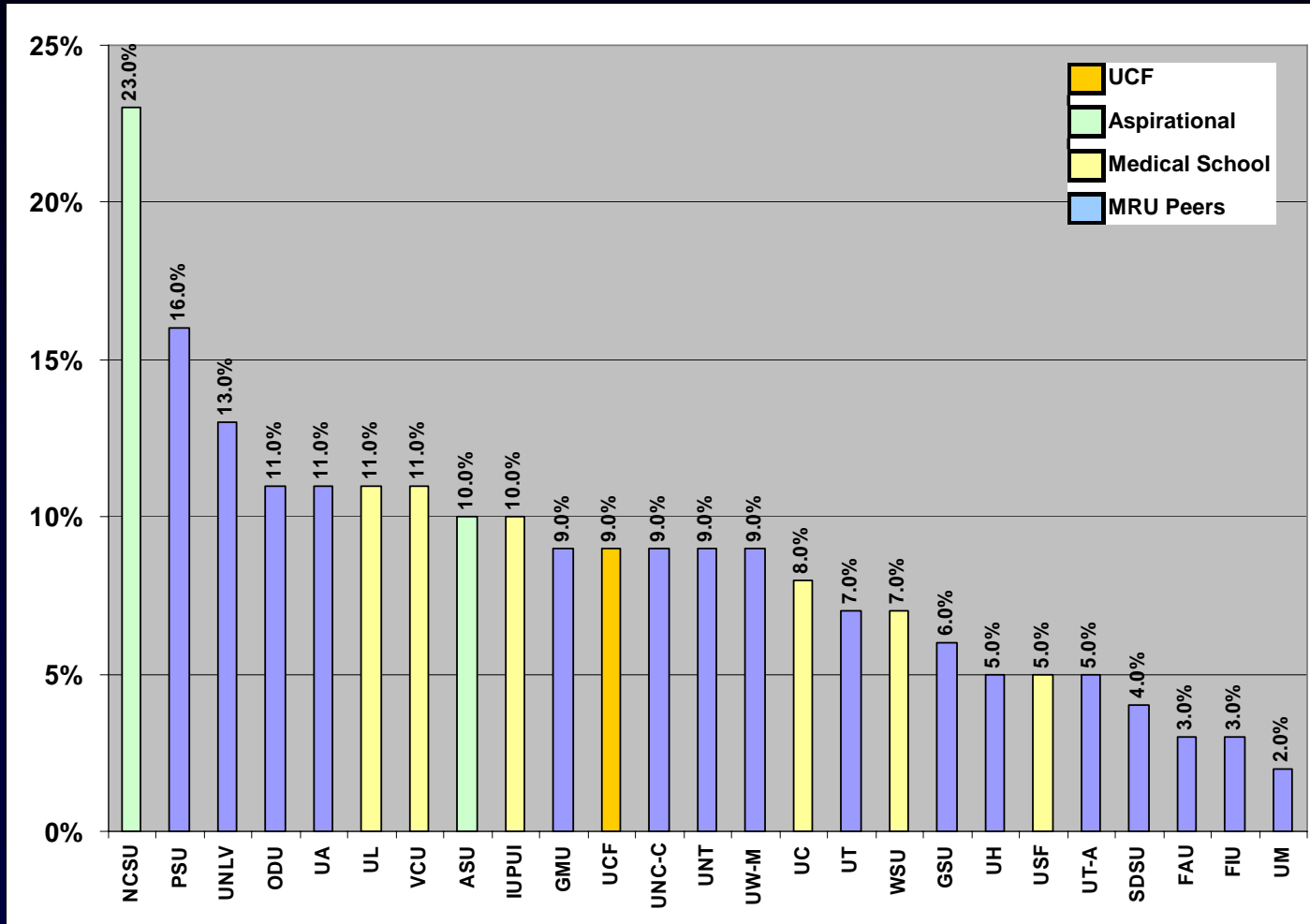
# 75<sup>th</sup> Percentile SAT Score

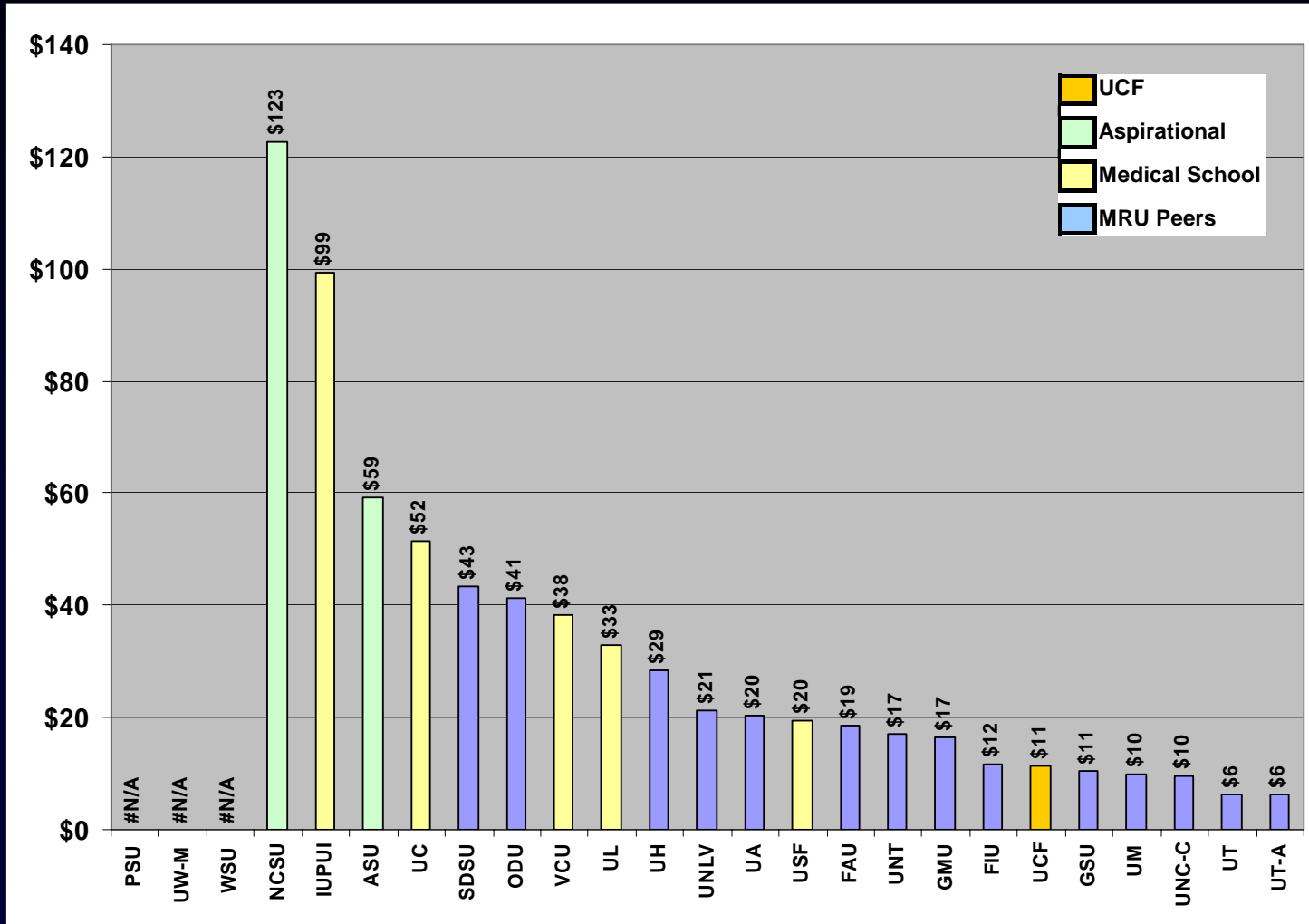
# Alumni Giving Percent of Undergraduates

# Annual Giving (\$ Millions)

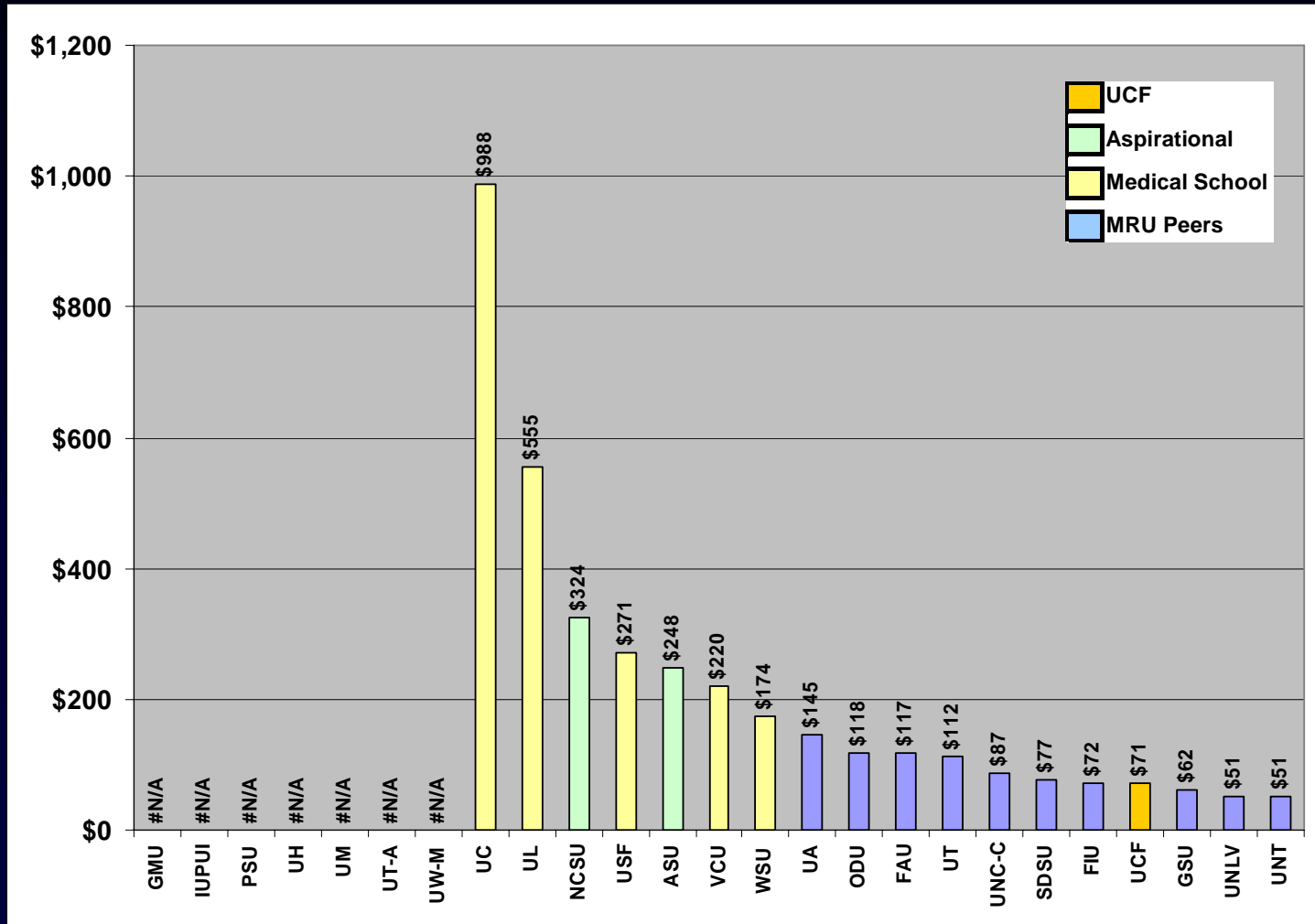

# Endowment

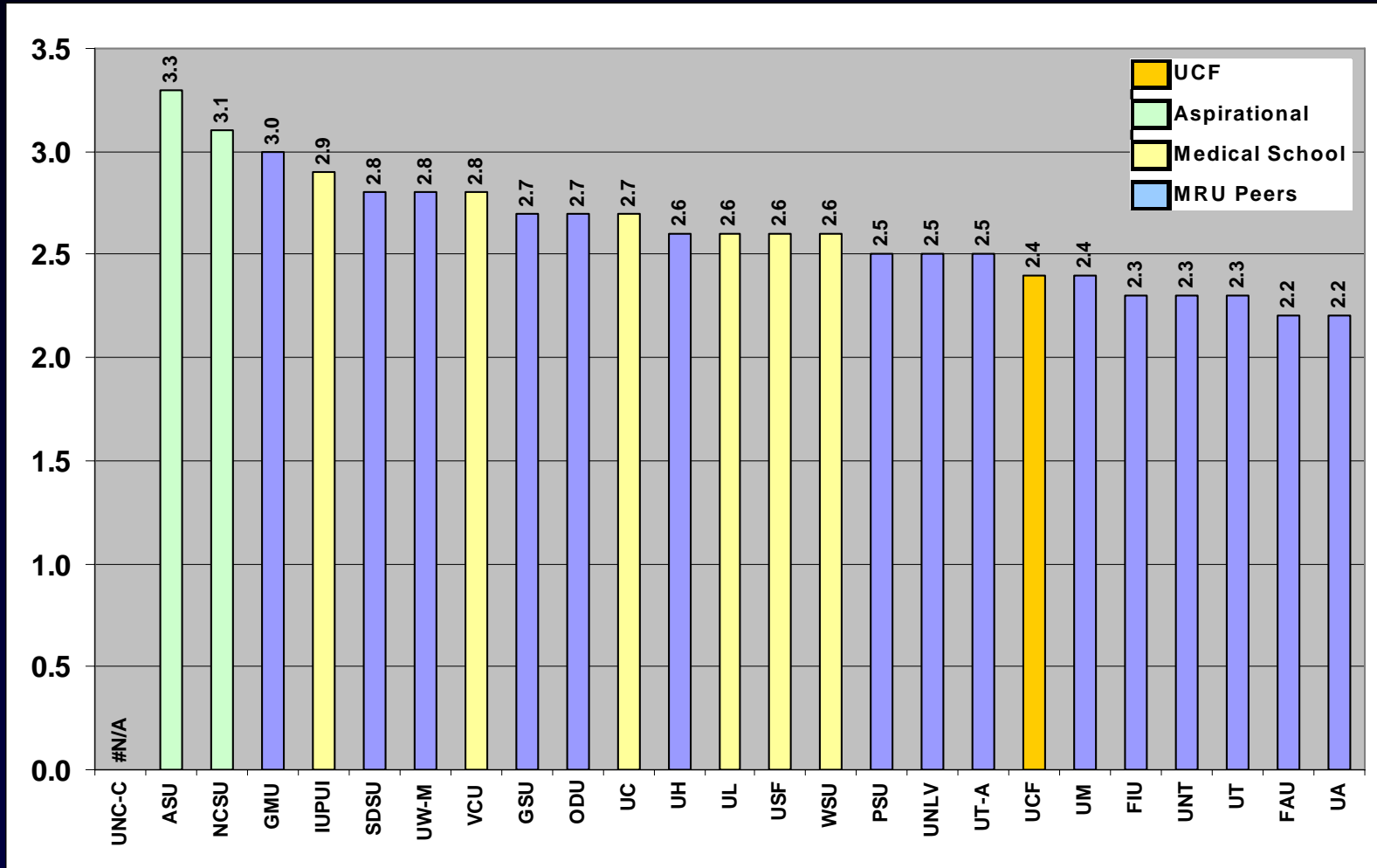
